Board of Trustees Regular Meeting  
February 16, 2009**

**Trustees Present:** Bob Gray, Pat Prenger, Chuck Evanhoe, Sue Hanley, Shelton Monger, Roberta Havholm, and Greg Herman

**Trustees Absent:** Mike Gerardi and Beverly Pendergast

Bob Gray called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

**Police Report:** City of Dayton Officer MacReynolds had no incidents to report in the past month.

**Visitors:** No Visitors.

**Northeast Priority Board:** No report.

**Minutes:** Shelton Monger moved the January 19, 2009 meeting minutes be accepted as edited. Roberta Havholm seconded.

**Vote: 7-0**

**Treasurer:** Dan Freeman, Treasurer, reported that the General Fund balance is \$41,184.24. Replacement reserve balance is \$41,076.63. We deposited 226 full assessments in January, and 307 so far in February, so there are 590 full assessments still open. This compares to 593 full assessments still open at the same time in 2008.

**Murmurs:** Roberta Havholm was present, and reported that the March Murmurs theme will be "General Membership Meeting". The pertinent articles will be Spring Soccer, 60 Mile Walk for Breast Cancer, Mad River/Fairborn School News, and Lifeguard Applications. It will be delivered by the February 28/March 1 weekend and will be printed in black ink on green paper.

**Communications Committee Report:** Mr. Gray said that he has about eight packets waiting to be delivered.

**Website:** No report.

**Green Areas:** Mitch Bird, the Green Areas Supervisor, was present and reported on various projects. He talked about the upcoming spring projects, including edging of the sidewalks and mulching. He also discussed the pool area lighting. If we want to add the planned light pole we will have to get a second pole installed to prevent the wires from going over the pool fence. The asset committee will prepare a recommendation.

**Pool:** Ellie Monger was present and reported that she is in the process of assessing the pool area needs for opening this year. She wants to put an advertisement in the Murmurs to get volunteers to do some of the smaller jobs. She is also reviewing hiring needs.

**Pool and Recreation Committee:** Mr. Monger reported that he doesn't have any significant additional information with regard to the drain cover requirements. An assessment of the work required has to wait until the pools are drained to allow access to the drains. The committee is however, now estimating the cost to be between \$5,500 and \$6000. He also discussed additional changes/repairs necessary in the pump and bath houses.

**Asset Management Committee:** Nothing to report.

**Old Business:** Mr. Prenger still has not received feed back with regard to the outdoor music during the summer.

**New Business:** Mr. Gray reported that Mayor McLin will be doing a neighborhood walk in the Dayton area of Forest Ridge in the May 2009 timeframe.

**Adjournment:** Chuck Evanhoe moved the meeting be adjourned and Roberta Havholm seconded.

Leaving your home every day knowing your doors and windows are locked, most feel their house is secure. Unfortunately, our family took this for granted.

On March 25<sup>th</sup>, our house was burglarized between 12:00 and 2:00 p.m. (in broad daylight). We live on Forest Ridge Blvd., which is the main thoroughfare in the Forest Ridge neighborhood. Arriving home at approximately 2:10 p.m. I found one of our garage doors open, the back door open (broken) and the door from the garage leading into the house open (broken). Not even thinking I raced upstairs to find our entire house ransacked. Our flat screen TV was gone, jewelry, laptop, cameras money, blank replacement checks and much more were gone. They dumped dressers, raided closets and cupboards.

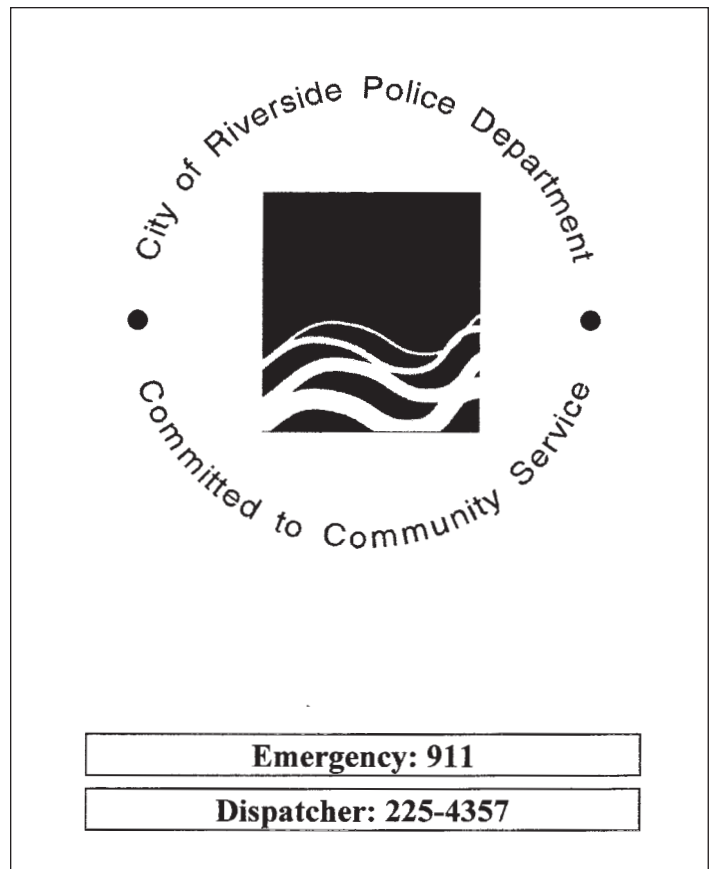
Immediately I contacted the Riverside police to report the burglary. They put me in touch with the Humane Society when I realized our family dog was missing. I was extremely fortunate to hear someone living off Silver Oak found our dog. She contacted me and returned our pet. In the midst of the panic and confusion I forgot her name. I want to personally thank her for protecting such an important part of our family. The persons who committed this burglary opened our garage door, drove their vehicle into the garage to load the items they stole. Fortunately in either driving in or out of the garage, they broke items off of their vehicle which are now evidence with the Riverside police dept. this is a Dodge Truck, 2002-2009 1500, 2500, or 3500 series because part of the lettering broke off along with the damaged pieces of the right hand mirror.

Since being burglarized on March 25 we have had an alarm service installed.

We are looking forward to another great year. Membership to the team is open to children five to eighteen years of age (as of June 1, 2009) whose parent/guardian is a member in good standing of the association. This year we are extending membership to include residents of the Villages of Forest Ridge, Wynwood and Quail Hollow.

## AWARDS! RIBBONS! BANQUET!

**Cost:** The registration fee for Forest Ridge Association Members is \$40 for the first child, \$75 for two children and \$100 for three or more children. The registration fee for residents of the Villages of Forest Ridge, Wynwood and Quail Hollow is \$50 for the first child, \$95 for two children and \$120 for three or more children. There will be a fee for each swimmer attending championships at the end of the season. The fee will be collected the 1st of July when swimmers sign up for championships.

**Open House/Suit-Up Day:** An open house to sign up for swim team, ask questions of committee members and purchase swimsuits, goggles, etc. will be held at the **FRA pool on Saturday, May 16<sup>th</sup>, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.** We will be taking orders for team suits that day as well. Payment will be due at the time you order your suit. We are continuing with the same suit as the past 2 years. We encourage everyone to buy a team suit to promote team spirit and to make it easy to spot FRFF teammates in the sea of swimmers during meets.

form/emergency medical form. Registrations will also be accepted the first week of practice.

We would like to encourage all FRA children to sign up. The swim team will provide your child with a wonderful opportunity to strengthen their swimming skills, to be recognized individually and as part of a team, and keep busy throughout the summer. The swim team travels to 4 neighboring pools every year and participates in the MVSA championship meet at Wittenberg University.

**Commitment:** All families registering their swimmers with FRFF will be expected to help fill the manpower needs of our home meets and away meets. Parents and responsible young adult volunteers are needed to run every meet. All families need to help at all meets. We will be having more stroke and turn clinics this year to assist with filling that particular position each meet. If everyone takes their turn it will run very smoothly.

Carlos Miguel Kolb, white male, date-of-birth 12/12/69, 39 years of age, 5-10, 190 lbs, brown hair and eyes, was released from Miami County jail on Wednesday, February 18, 2009. Kolb is a prolific thief who targets automobiles and automobile components (stereos and amps), items left in plain view inside automobiles, lawn and garden tools, etc. Investigators believe Kolb was responsible for numerous residential burglaries, thefts from automobiles and auto thefts that occurred in the Pheasant Ridge neighborhood of northeast Dayton this past December and January. He may also be responsible for several auto thefts that occurred earlier this year in southeast Dayton. Kolb is known to stay with an acquaintance, Timothy Hancock, on Buckner Drive in Huber Heights. Kolb's

girlfriend stays at 2428 Valley Street and his mother resides in Miami Township.

Please take heed of the following advice, particularly those of you residing in the Pheasant Ridge neighborhood: Be certain that your garage doors are secured at all times. Remove any and all valuables from your motor vehicles and secure them in your residence. Do not leave car keys inside your car, even if it is parked inside a locked garage. (One resident learned this lesson the hard way!) If you do not already own an anti-theft device for your car, you should consider purchasing one. # Call for Lifeguard Applications 2009 Season

The Forest Ridge Association is accepting applications for lifeguards and Recreation Supervisors for the 2009 season. Those interested must have current Lifeguard training, Standard First Aid, and CPR-for the Professional Rescuer. Those with old Lifeguard Training will be required to update when the pool opens. WSI certification is recommended for consideration but not required for the available positions. Applications should be in résumé form and must include copies of the front and back of all certifications. The résumé should include any experience with young children, school, and community activities. Also include 2 written references from former employers, teachers, or community leaders. Previous employees of FRA do not need to submit references. The staff is responsible for helping with the opening of the pool and must be available to work on weekends during May (possible exceptions if away at school). You must also include your swimsuit and shirt size, date you can start full-time, all dates you must have off, and when you return to school.

Each year of experience means one season consisting of at least eight full weeks. For example, if an individual was hired prior to June 30 and works through Labor Day, the individual will be paid the next step the next year. If the individual is hired after July 1, the individual will be paid the same step for the entire next year. Prior experience at another pool, regardless of the number of years, will qualify the individual for a Step 2 if it can be verified that the individual has at least one full year of experience.

Residents of Forest Ridge receive preference for these positions, assuming they are otherwise qualified. WSI qualified applicants are preferred.

<sup>1</sup> Lifeguard certifications must be current at all times. It is the responsibility of each employee to provide such certification to the Recreation Area Manager. The base rate will be effective from the date the manager receives the certification, not retroactive to the date of the certification. If the Manager does not have a current lifeguard certification on file, the employee will be paid \$3.95/hour until such certification is provided.

<sup>2</sup> Current WSI certificates must be provided to the Recreation Area Manager in order to receive this rate. Once the WSI certification expires, the individual will be paid at the base rate until a current WSI certificate is again provided to the Recreation Area Manager. The WSI rate is effective on the date the Recreation Area Manager receives the current certificate, not retroactive to the effective date of the certificate

Are you looking for an opportunity to involve yourself in an interesting, fun-filled and rewarding activity that revolves around the rich history of the Dayton area? Then volunteering for one or more of the volunteer positions at Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum may be a perfect fit for you. First let me introduce myself. My name is Sherry Pesut and I have been a Volunteer Historical Tour Guide at Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum for the past three years. I have been teaching the History of Woodland Cemetery the last two years at University of Dayton in its Osher Life Long Learning Institute for the 50 and over crowd. I also give lectures to clubs and organizations throughout the city and just recently started teaching the History of Woodland Cemetery at Sinclair Community College, for its Life Long Learning program. I love Woodland and all of the history there, so let me share a little with you.

Woodland Cemetery, which is adjacent to the University of Dayton, was founded in 1841 by John Van Cleve, son of the first pioneers to settle here in 1796. His father Benjamin Van Cleve was the first postmaster of Dayton. Woodland is the 5<sup>th</sup> oldest garden cemetery in the nation and it is the most historical because of the many famous people who are buried in Woodland, such as the Wright Brothers, Erma Bombeck, Charles Kettering, James Ritty (invented the cash register), John Patterson (started NCR), Paul Laurence Dunbar and many other Ohio inventors and famous politicians to name a few.

These last three years have been some of the best times in my life. I have had the opportunity to meet so many new people each time I take a tour out into Woodland. Woodland

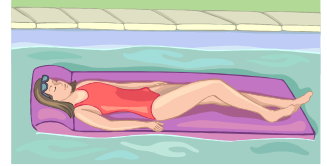
Cemetery is probably the best-kept secret in Dayton. There are so many people who have no idea what a treasure we have here. My plan is to remedy this and spread the word about the wonders of Woodland.

The cemetery has offered me a part-time position with the title of Volunteer Coordinator to start and build a volunteer program that has something for everyone who wants to volunteer some of his or her time. Let me name some of the volunteer jobs that will be available.

1. Leading historical tours out into the cemetery
2. Conducting mausoleum tours
3. Helping with research projects
4. Helping with Archive retrieval
5. Tree tour guide for the people interested in the arboretum part of Woodland.
6. Helping with events held at Woodland
7. Landscaping areas in the cemetery
8. Helping with trade show events
9. Decorating the mausoleum for special events and holiday
10. Speaking at Libraries and Schools
11. Help raise funds for restoration projects

The above list is just a start of what is available. I will be setting up historical tour classes to help you learn all of the history that is needed to do historical tours. 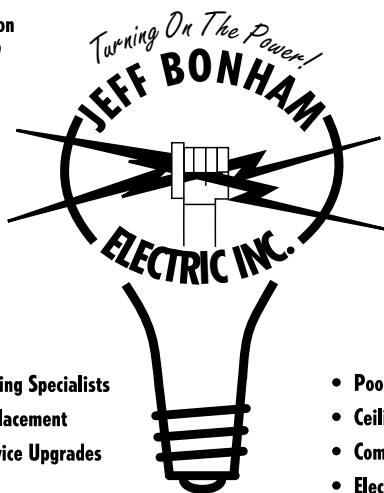
