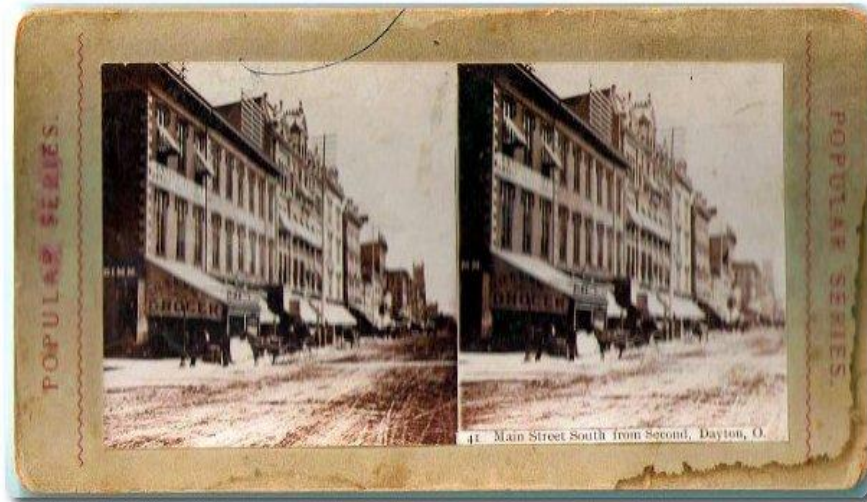


# The City of Dayton



## Weekly Crime Stats – EPOD North

December 5, 2011 thru December 11, 2011

Greetings! Thank You for being part of the City Of Dayton

For this week, total reported crime in the First district is [Down 6%](#) compared to this time 2010, and [Down 13%](#) from 2009. This week compared to last week total crime is [Down 48%](#).

### Problem Oriented Policing:      **Convenience Store Robbery**

It is also crucial to interview as many apprehended offenders as possible to find out how they make their decisions.

### **Offenses**

- How many convenience store robberies have occurred?
- What is the ratio of attempted robberies to completed robberies?
- What proportion of robberies (and attempts) is reported to police? If some robberies are not reported to police, why?
- What proportion of robberies have been repeat robberies (occurring at the same convenience store) within the past year?
- What is the typical length of time between repeat robberies?
- How long do robbers take to complete the robbery? Do they use a “straight” or “customer” approach (as described above)?
- How do employees react to robberies?
- What types of weapons are used, if any? Have any injuries resulted?
- How many employees and customers are typically present in the store during robberies?

- What are the usual escape routes or methods?
- How much money or merchandise is typically stolen?
- What other financial costs do convenience stores incur from robberies (e.g., repair costs, lost business, insurance premium increases)?

## Offenders

- Are there many different offenders involved in the robberies, or is a small group of prolific offenders responsible?
- How many of the prolific offenders have records for committing store robberies? How many have recently been released from prison?
- How much planning do offenders do?
- Do offenders work in gangs? How many offenders are in the gangs?
- Do offenders belong to any particular ethnic, occupational, or other group?
- What proportion of offenders are juveniles?
- Are offenders under the influence of drugs or alcohol while committing robberies?
- What proportion of offenders commit robberies primarily to support a drug or alcohol habit?
- Do offenders appear to be familiar with the premises robbed? If so, how do they get the information (e.g., from complicit employees, by careful casing of the store, by prior visits as a customer, by prior robberies at that store)?
- Do employees recognize offenders as familiar to the location?
- How do offenders get to the stores? On foot? In vehicles?
- Are offenders drawn to the area by robbery opportunities or for some other reason (e.g., illegal drug markets)?

## Targets

- Which types of convenience stores are most at risk of robbery? What types are at least risk?
- Which stores are being robbed repeatedly? What do high-risk stores have in common with one another? How do they differ from low-risk stores?
- How long have high-risk stores been in business?
- How big are the stores? Are they part of a larger chain? If so, how does the robbery experience vary among stores in the chain? How does it compare with that of similar stores in other chains?
- What time do the stores close?
- Is the property isolated? Is lack of natural surveillance a contributory factor?
- What proportion of stores has gas pumps?
- What site features facilitate robbery? Corner location? Rear access?
- Is there evidence of collusion between staff and robbers?

## Locations/Times

- When do robberies usually occur (time of day, day of week, month or season of year)?
- What is the nature of the surrounding neighborhood?
- Where do events concentrate? Are they clustered near major roads? Near known drug markets? (Computerized crime mapping can facilitate robbery analysis.)

## Current Responses

- What is the clearance rate for convenience store robberies?
- What security measures have the stores taken to prevent robbery?

- Do store employees follow correct cash-handling and other robbery prevention procedures?
- What robbery prevention measures, if any, are mandated by law? To what extent are those mandates inspected and enforced?
- What training or robbery prevention information is provided to store owners, managers, and employees frequently during winter months.

#### **Burglary:**

**2715 Ridge Avenue-** On Wednesday, December 7, 2011, between 8:30 am and 7:00 pm, this location was the victim of burglary. Officers arrived and were told by the victim someone forced their way into the house. Officers discovered the rear door was kicked. The suspect(s) stole a laptop HP computer and a vase which held the victims costume jewelry. At this time there is no suspect information.

**457 Hunter Avenue-** On Wednesday, December 7, 2011, between 10:30 am and 7:30 pm, a citizen was the victim of burglary. Officers arrived and were told an unknown person(s) broke a window on the rear door allowing entry. Inside they stole purses, jewelry, and two televisions. At this time there is no suspect information.

#### **Breaking and Entering:**

**3100 East Third Street-** On Tuesday, December 6, 2011, at approximately 7:40 am, "Rice Chinese Food" was the victim of an attempted breaking and entering. Officers were investigating a GTA complaint and it was reported the suspect of that crime also attempted to break into the Chinese restaurant. He shattered a glass window but never made entry. He is described as black male approximately 35 yoa, light complexion, Black hair, Goatee, with a red shirt.

**3129 East Third Street-** On Wednesday, December 7, 2011, at approximately 11:00 pm, Food for Less was victim of breaking and entering. Officers arrived and found the building secure. Officers walked around the business and discovered palets stacked up allowing access to the roof. An employee arrived and allowed officers to enter the business. It was then discovered the suspect(s) entered the office area and stole 50

packs of Newport cigarettes. There is video footage However, the employee didn't know how to access they system. Detectives are following up.

**15 Henry Street-** On Saturday, December 10, 2011, at approximately 2:13 pm, this location was the victim of breaking and entering. Officers arrived and discovered an unknown person forced entry into a vacant structure. Once inside they stole a dirt bike described as a 1985 Honda 250 Cr Dirt bike. The Dirt Bike is red and white and missing a foot peg on the right side. At this time there is no suspect information. A broadcast was completed for the Dirt Bike and Officers are continuing to investigate.

**174 Alton Avenue-** On Saturday, December 10, 2011 at approximately 7:15 pm, this location was the victim of breaking and entering. Officers arrived and found a male identified as Michael Eyler inside the garage. Officers approached and ordered Eyler out of the garage. In the process Eyler set a crack pipe onto a ledge as he walked out. Officers Cuffed Eyler and he was arrested and charged with breaking and entering and possession of drug paraphernalia. It should be noted Officers discovered a pry bar and wire cutters inside the vacant garage.

#### **Grand Theft Auto:**

**2626 East Third Street-** On Tuesday, December 6, 2011, at approximately 6:45 am, a citizen was the victim of theft of motor vehicle. Officers arrived and were told an unknown person without permission stole her silver PT Cruiser. Officers sent out a MDT broadcast of the vehicle. While the victim was getting a ride home she observed her vehicle parked in-front of 3100 East Third St and a black male with a pink do-rag throwing a large rock through the window of "Rice" Chinese restaurant. Officers were contacted by the victim and arrived in the area. The suspect fled in the vehicle prior to officer's arrival. However, the vehicle was then recovered in the back yard of 123 South Harbine Street. A K9 track was completed but met with negative results. Description of the suspect was a Black male approximately 35 yoa, light complexion, Black hair, Goatee, with a red shirt.

**776 Troy Street-** On Wednesday, December 7, 2011, between 7:30 pm and 8:15 pm, a citizen was victim of theft from motor vehicle. Officers arrived and were told unknown person(s) stole his van. The victim reported the van was unlocked and it is possible he left the keys inside of the vehicle. The vehicle was later located in-front of 1917 Walter Street. The vehicle was discovered to be missing a stereo, tool box with tools and

factory speakers. The vehicle was returned to the owner. It should be noted a neighbor stated he observed two white males walk away from the vehicle. There is no further information at this time.

**67 South Garfield Street-** On Thursday, December 8, 2011, at approximately 12:30 am, a citizen was the victim of attempted grand theft of automobile. Officers arrived and were by the owner of the vehicle that the vehicle was unlocked due to thefts in the area and she didn't want a broken window. She also explained the reason the vehicle wasn't stolen is because there is a chip in the starting system which won't allow the vehicle to start without the key. There is no suspect information at this time.

**106 South Sperling Avenue-** On Thursday, December 8, 2011, at approximately 12:53 am, a citizen was the victim of grand theft of automobile. Officers were told the victim woke after hearing his vehicle start and upon looking outside observed his 1989 Buick Century drive away. The vehicle is blue in color with Ohio license number DGH4605. A broadcast was completed for the vehicle. At this time there is no suspect information.

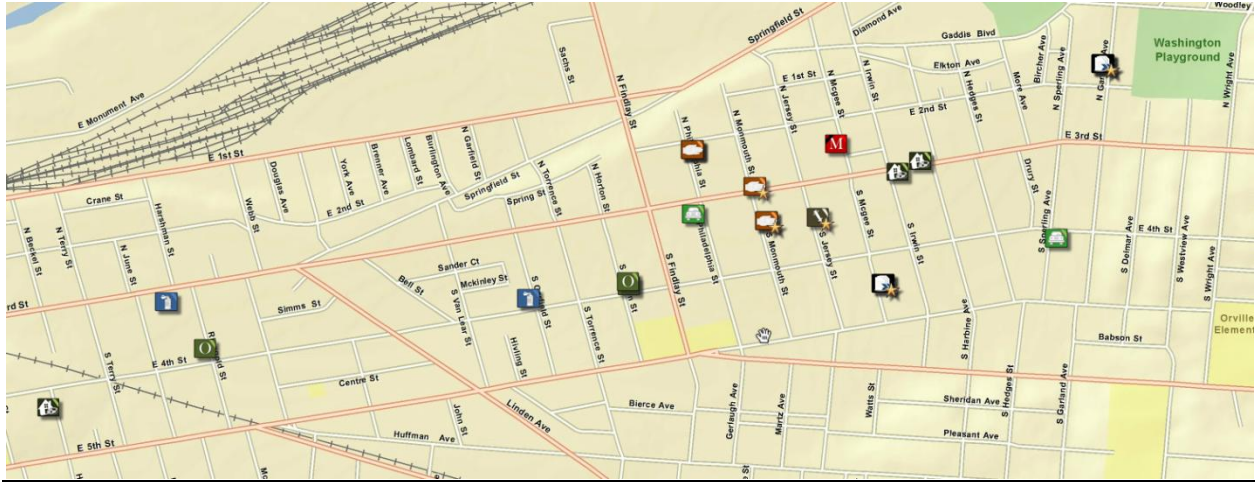
#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle:**

**521 Troy Street-** On Tuesday, December 6, 2011, between 7:00 am and 7:00 am on December 7, 2011, a citizen was the victim of theft from motor vehicle. Officers arrived and were told an unknown person(s) damaged the exterior of the victim's vehicle, breaking windows of the vehicle. The suspects then entered the vehicle and stole a stereo. At this time there is no suspect information.

**808 Troy Street-** On Tuesday, December 6, 2011, between 6:00 pm and 8:00 am, a citizen was the victim of theft from motor vehicle. Officers arrived and were told an unknown person(s) broke out both front windows of the vehicle, entered the vehicle, and stole a cordless drill. At this time there is no suspect information.

**1714 Rangeley Avenue-** On Wednesday, December 7, 2011, between 10:00 pm and 10:30 am, a citizen was the victim of theft from motor vehicle. Officers arrived and were told an unknown person(s) entered an unlocked vehicle and stole a purse, car keys and jewelry. At this time there is no suspect information.
